Leeds City Council are considering the possibility of installing a 'School Street' outside Bramhope Primary School.

'School Streets' are where motorised traffic is restricted on specific roads around schools during drop-off and pick-up times, during term-time. The aim is to make the area outside school more welcoming for those wanting to walk, scoot or cycle to school and increase the number of pupils choosing these modes. School Streets may also help to reduce road danger, improve air quality and reduce congestion. You can find out more about School Streets by following this link: www.leeds.gov.uk/schoolstreets

To establish a School Street for Bramhope Primary School, motorised traffic would be restricted on Breary Rise for short periods of time in the morning (approx. 8.30 am - 9.15 am) and afternoon (2.45 pm - 3.30 pm). Vehicles would not be able to enter Breary Rise from Breary Lane. (There would be some exemptions including residents and businesses located within the School Street, Emergency Vehicles, Blue Badge holders and liveried delivery vehicles).

If you currently drop-off or pick-up and park in this area, you would instead need to:

- Walk, scoot or cycle to school
- Park somewhere else and walk/wheel to the school entrance

The intention is to launch the scheme in the new school year. However, ahead of this, the council will undertake a series of steps to ensure the scheme is supported before it is implemented:

- Parent and Guardian Consultation
- Residents' Consultation
- Implementation of Traffic Regulation Orders and Necessary works
