Yes, our school gardeners have done it again! We have been awarded gold standard from Leeds in Bloom for the third year running. The judges make it clear that the knowledge and enthusiasm of our pupils makes a huge contribution to the high standard of Bramhope's entry and we are already looking forward to a bumper crop of pumpkins!

Collaborative Learning Trust

Many of you will be aware of last term's consultation with staff, parents/carers and members of the local community about the possible formation of a Multi Academy Trust (MAT) with Prince Henry's Grammar School. The summary report of the consultation was published in May 2018 and as a result of the overall positive response to the consultation, the Collaborative Learning Trust officially came into existence on 1st September 2018.

Prince Henry's has already joined the new Trust and governors at Bramhope Primary School are overseeing a comprehensive investigation to decide whether Bramhope will join the MAT. If Bramhope decides to join the Trust, this will not happen until December and we will keep you updated on progress throughout the process.

Secondary school information meeting

I am sure that parents of children in Y6 are aware that they need to apply for a place at a secondary school before 31 October. A number of parents have asked me about secondary school options and admission to Prince Henry's and I thought it might be helpful to hold an information meeting to clarify the admissions process, outline the admissions proposals and answer any questions you may have. The meeting is open to parents of children of all ages and will be held at **7:30pm on 11 October**. I would encourage parents to ensure they have visited school open days before the meeting as the evening will also be an opportunity to reflect on what they might have seen in different schools. Nearer the time I will be asking parents to confirm whether they will be attending the secondary school information meeting but please do save the date for now.
