







Cursive letter formations







THE TRIPOD PENCIL GRIP

Both right and left handed children should be encouraged to use the tripod grip which allows the pen/pencil to be held securely whilst allowing controlled movements of the pen/pencil nib.




- 1) Grip the pencil with your index finger and thumb with the nib pointing away.
- With your free hand, spin the pencil from underneath.
- Use your middle finger to support the underside of the pencil.


