This is Tikal in Guatemala and the main plaza. The plaza is the area in between the pyramids.



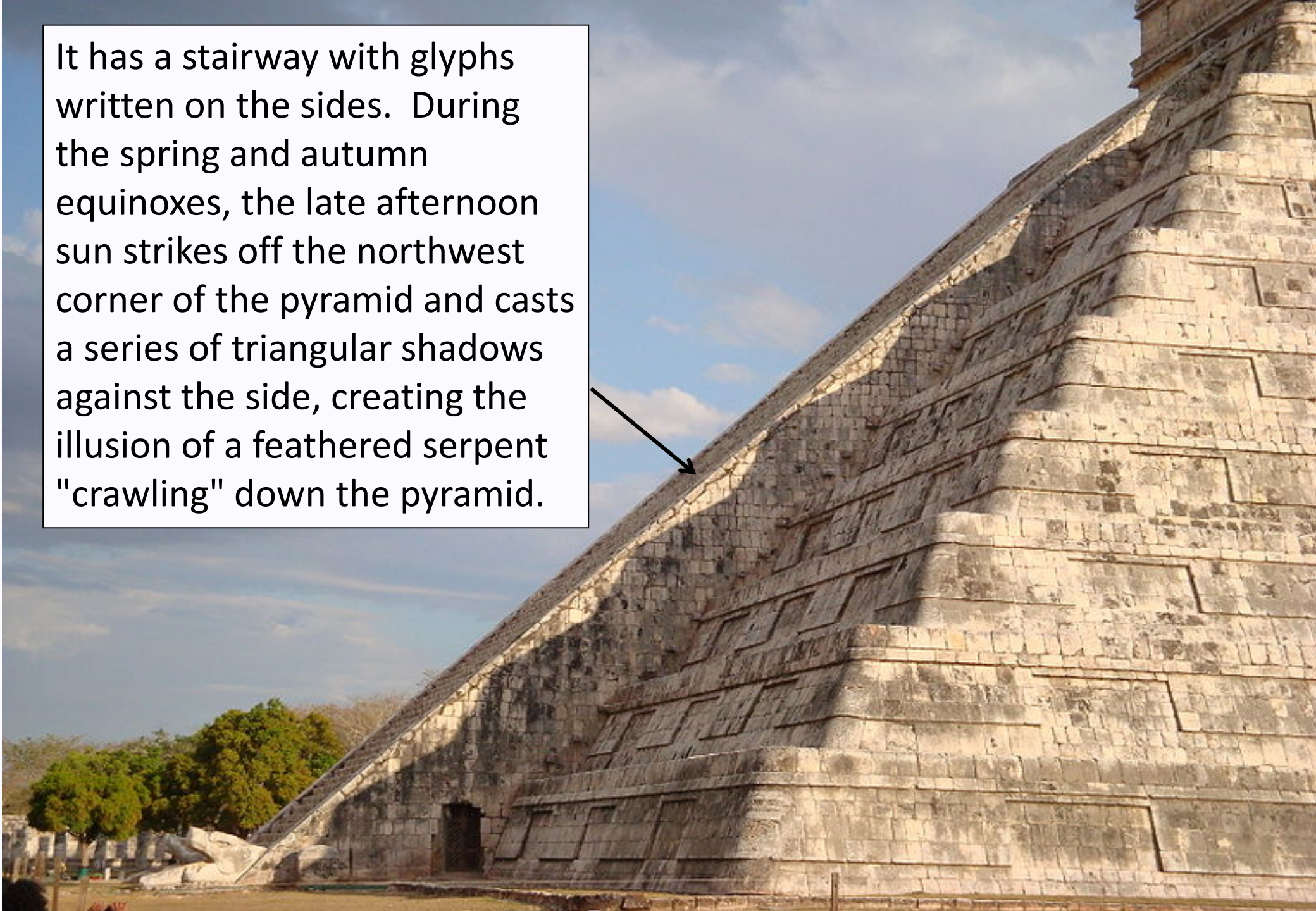

Maya pyramids and temples

El Castillo at Chichen Itza is a temple to the god Kukulcan, a plumed serpent.



It has a stairway with glyphs written on the sides. During the spring and autumn equinoxes, the late afternoon sun strikes off the northwest corner of the pyramid and casts a series of triangular shadows against the side, creating the illusion of a feathered serpent "crawling" down the pyramid.





Maya palaces were large, multi-storied buildings where the king and royal family lived. They had courtyards, patios, towers and walled gardens to give the family some privacy.
