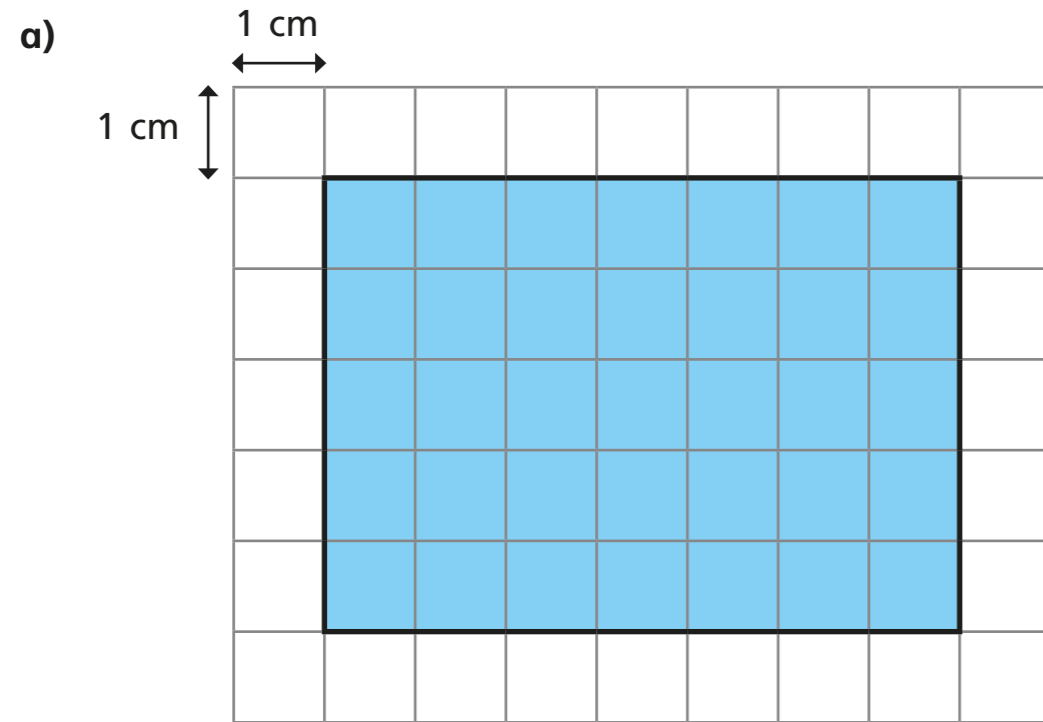
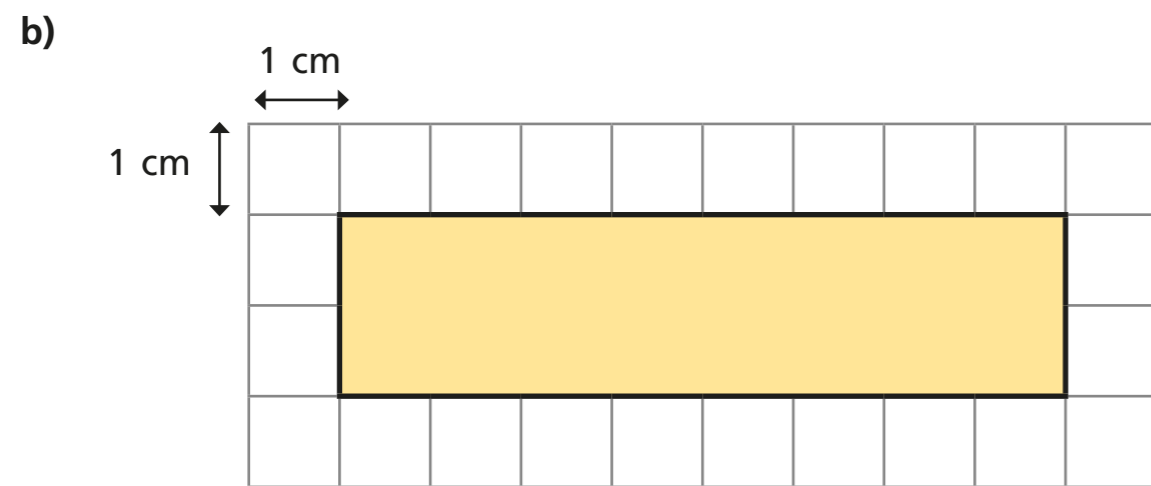


Perimeter of a rectangle

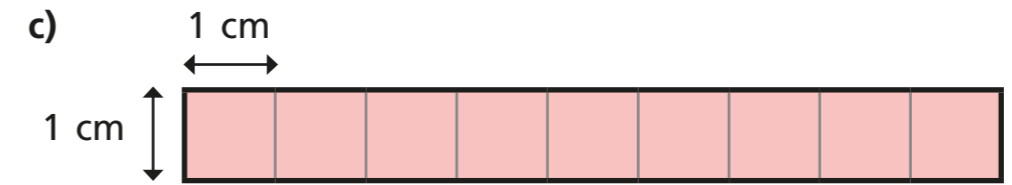

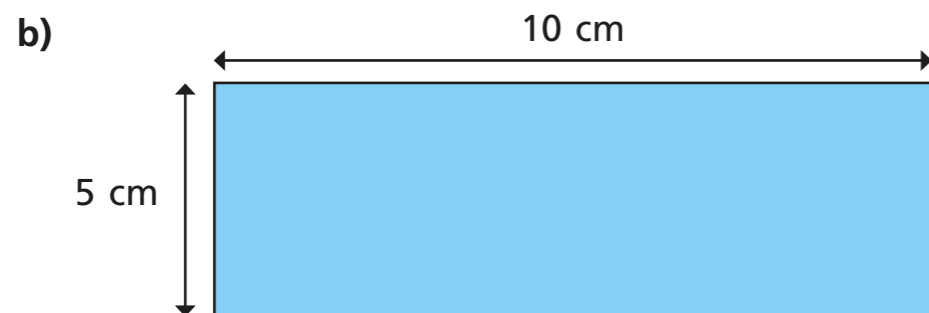
