# **English -Reading**

- -Did you alter your voice for any direct speech?
- -Did you vary the way you spoke to reflect the events in your story and to keep your audience engaged?

# English – Writing Can you write an alternative version of a traditional tale?

Using the plan you created last week, write your story.

#### Remember:

- -For each new picture on your plan, miss a line and start a new **paragraph**.
- -Can you vary the way you start your sentences? Maybe try **time words** like Next, After that, Eventually.
- -Try to extend your sentences using a **conjunctions** (and, but, until, because).
- -Think about your use of **capital letters** at the start of sentences, for the names of characters and places.
- -Try to include a variety of punctuation including inverted commas for direct speech, commas in a list for expanded noun phrases, apostrophes for contractions and possession as well as question marks and exclamation marks.
- -Add lots of 'WOW' words including a variety of verbs (action words), adverbs (slowly, cautiously) and adjectives (describing words).
