

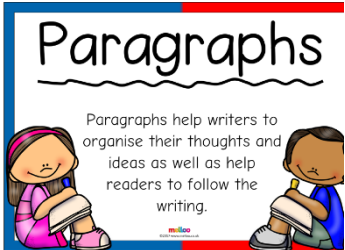

Do you think you could do this and give away your item in reality if you had to?</p>	<p>Here is a list of things you need to think about when planning your trip.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Where are you going? • How will you travel? Car, train etc • How many people are going on your day trip? • What meals will be involved? Think about all the food you will want to eat during the day and the drinks you will need. • Will you want to buy a souvenir? • Will you want to buy any treats whilst you are there? (Popcorn at the cinema or an ice cream at the seaside) • Will you need any money for additional activities once you are at your destination? <p>Task 2 Here comes the tricky part. You only have £100 to spend on your day trip. Can you afford to buy or pay for everything you had planned?</p> <p>How could you lower the cost of your trip?</p> <p>Task 3 – The money the amount you had to spend on your trip is called your budget.</p> <p>Can you think of any other times you or your parents might have to stick to a budget? Why is it important to stick to a budget sometimes?</p> <p>If you have planned your day trip and have managed to keep the cost down, why not save this and see if you can make your trip happen once lockdown has been lifted?</p>
