

## STUDENT PORTFOLIO 2020 – INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLETION

Hello everyone,

Normally students would be given the Transition Portfolio either when we visit their Primary School or when they attend the Family Interview. Clearly this year is different and unfortunately neither of these will happen in their usual way.

Instead, we are sharing this with you either in their primary school setting or if the student is not returning with their parent.

We use the portfolio to gather evidence of the child's progress at primary school and also to share information about them with the KS3 team and most particularly their form tutor. We also use it to introduce them to some of the ideas and expectations of Prince Henry's and to get them thinking about what secondary school is like. This year, more than ever, we feel this is really relevant.

### **Instructions**

Page 1 – Please complete with first name and surname and Primary School

Page 2 – Attitude to Learning – used at PHGS as a key indicator of student effort and engagement. Please read the descriptions and rank your own Attitude to Learning, your primary school teacher can give their own ranking.

Page 3 – English overview – Self-reflect on progress in literacy in KS2

Page 4 & 5 – English overview – using the supporting English Transition resources, students complete a piece of work about a fantasy character

Page 6 – Maths – Students complete a research task about Fibonacci Numbers" and "Fibonacci Sequences"

Page 7 – Maths – Self-reflect on progress in Numeracy in KS2

Page 8 – Science – Students can either record, produce a poster or image of their favourite Science work in KS2

Page 9 – Science – Self-reflect on progress in Science in KS2

Page 10 – Languages – Self-reflect on work done in Languages in KS2

Page 11 – Geography – Self-reflect on work done in Geography in KS2 – space to show best work

Page 12 – History – Task to introduce Prince Henry and design his coat of arms

Page 13 & 14 – Research task using school website to find out key and interesting facts about Prince Henry's

Page 15 & 16 – Postcard 'All About Me', Chance for students to share some information about themselves. Will be given to form tutors to assist with getting to know the students and allowing them to match up people who will get on well.
